Lodge members have contributed to the successful running of two Klondike Derbies held at Pine Hill. From running a concession stand to fuel hungry Scouts during the day, to conducting an exciting evening campfire (and creating the largest bonfire I've ever seen!), Arrowmen helped to promote our values of cheerful service. We even were able to conduct formal visits to many Troops and held elections in the field! Kudos to the LEC members who spearheaded these events.

On March 8, 21 registered Arrowmen descended on Pine Hill for a Day of Service. Arrowmen cleaned up the areas around many of the buildings in the camp, cleared gutters, and cleaned up fire pits in all of the campsites. Others cleared trails overgrown with vegetation and clogged with fallen leaves. A dedicated group fought their way through thick overgrowth and leaf piles to restore the Cub Trail leading from Cub Field all the way to the ranges up on the hill, discovering several very large trees that had fallen onto the trail. Adults brought a chainsaw to clear the trail, which was nearly lost if it wasn't for dashes of paint and reflectors attached to trees along the way. All of these Arrowmen contributed greatly to preparing Pine Hill for the busy summer camping season, and I'm grateful for their cheerful service.

We have a busy yet fun-filled Induction weekend coming up. Please find time to welcome our new Brothers into the Lodge once they complete their Induction tasks. Oodles of Awards!

This spring, we are having an induction weekend. As a member, you can become an elangomat to help ordeal candidates become members of our lodge. If you serve as an elangomat once, you will be eligible for an elangomat patch. For every time you serve after that, you will be eligible to receive a feather pin. This award is available to both adults and youth. You will likely remember your induction into the OA, and how they helped guide you on your trail. You can choose to help another in the same way that they did for you. This will also help you get service hours, so you will be able to become eligible for the 20 hour chenille, and eventually towards the 100 hour chenille. Please consider being an elangomat this spring or fall! Another award you could earn by coming to the ordeal is by helping in ceremonies. If you help in ceremonies at all, you will be a part of the ceremonies team, who hand out awards at the banquet as well.
